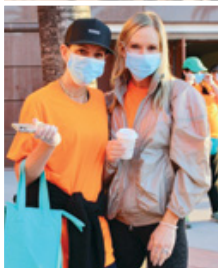

Just before COVID-19 stay-at-home orders were issued, the Food Bank took action to protect volunteers by suspending large-group gatherings at the Distribution Center. A door-to-door Food Box Program was formed, with boxes being assembled by displaced foodservice industry employees. Each week, the program delivers over 6,400 boxes of nutritious, shelf-stable food to children and families at after school sites, to low-income seniors and to individuals with critical care needs.

More than 200 Harvest Truck Brigade volunteers—using their own vehicles—answer group text dispatches to deliver food boxes to designated sites in all 34 Orange County cities each week. The Food Bank continues to adapt to meet the ever-growing need for food as unemployment reaches historic levels in the county.

In the early months of the pandemic, Second Harvest partnered with the City of Anaheim, Anaheim Ducks and the Honda Center to orchestrate food support on an unprecedented scale: Saturday Pop-Up Drive Thru Food Distributions at the Honda Center in Anaheim. The weekly events, which began March 21 and end June 27, have provided more than 1 million pounds (as of May 23) of supplemental food for an average of 4,500 cars over a four-hour period.
